#### View from the Chair

It is difficult to know whether to call this a summer or an autumn newsletter, as due to the mixture of sun and rain making ideal growing conditions, all the crops are several weeks in advance. The new boundary fence on the Back Hill site has, after a financial agreement with the City Council, been completed to everybody's satisfaction.

The idea of having an allotment still remains popular, most of our sites are full, and the waiting list is starting to increase again.

Looking to the future and bearing in mind that we on the committee are all getting older, the Association would like to encourage younger plot holders to become involved with the running of the allotments.

Rents can be paid by bank transfer, or in person on Saturday 30 September 2017 at the Elv Hort Soc shop at the Beet Club, Lynn Road, or by post. Full details will be provided on your rent

Rents will be at the levels agreed by the March 2017 AGM. All rents must be received by the end of October 2017 and any plot holders with outstanding rent after this time will be considered to be in breach of their tenancy agreement.

#### New Barns site report by Graham Bond

The year so far has been quite busy regarding site maintenance. Reinstatement of the main path following the water pipe installation has continued in addition to clearing a small plot with a view to planting an area of wild flowers, and the measuring and subdividing of plots, as well as the usual mowing and strimming.

We have also been fortunate this year with regard to thefts and vandalism, the only item to have disappeared was a wheelbarrow. The site is fully tenanted and most of the plots are well tended.

The newly-installed water supply was much used during the hot dry spell in June, but this was followed by a very wet July when watering was rarely required. Picking of the crops is now in full swing, most are supplying us with a bountiful harvest and certain ones, particularly soft fruit, are maturing early and being very prolific.



The site also enjoyed success in the annual judging, with one tenant being awarded the cup for the overall Best Small Plot.

Thoughts are now turning towards planning for the winter period. Site maintenance will continue and there is a new supply of manure to be arranged. The site reps will again be asking for volunteers to help in carrying out these tasks as they will be of benefit to all on the allotments.

The new paths have improved access to the plots and made the trips to the water troughs quick and easy – something appreciated when the site was at its driest.

All site reps have been very cheered to see the amount of hard work all plot holders have put in to their plots – it is fabulous when arriving to see tall canes of climbing beans, huge squash plants (and at the moment there are some large pumpkins and squashes to be seen), cabbages and raspberries. There is even a patch of brambles in the corner producing some very tasty blackberries!

The judging of Upherds for the Best Small Plot has been completed along with the judging of our other Allotment Association sites. The results are announced in the secretary's report and Upherds is well represented.

We have been approached by the students of Highfield School in Downham Road who have been looking for a local allotment plot they could use. We have agreed to look into this and have decided to meet staff and students on site in September. Fortunately, one of our plot holders is a staff member at Highfield and it is on her plot that the students

could start their endeavours. If that works well, they may be able to take on their own plot in the future. If anyone has any ideas, concerns or would like to be involved in this project to help, please let your site reps know. This could be an opportunity to help some of the most vulnerable young people in our area.
